



# BACKGROUND

The Hon'ble Prime Minister had mandated the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG) to hold virtual conferences/webinars with District Collectors and other officers. A specific theme/sector may be taken up in each month, which past award winners since the inception of the scheme under that sector are invited to present their experiences.

In his address on Civil Services Day, 2022, the Hon'ble Prime Minister suggested that training institutes should conduct virtual sessions of one to one and half hours with the award winners as the Lead Speakers, to disseminate the best practices.

Accordingly, DARPG conducts National Good Governance Webinars, one webinar a month on different themes, on the last Friday of every month, over the year 2022 - 2024, to highlight and disseminate the best practices and sharing of experiences of the award-winning institution to facilitate replication by other States/Districts.

These Webinars covered the PM award winning initiatives on the themes 'Improving Public Service Delivery'; 'Health'; 'Aspirational District Programme'; 'Public Grievance Redressal'; 'Environment', 'Public Participation (Jan Bhagidari) through Swachh Bharat Mission'; 'Innovations at District and Centre levels'; 'Jal/Water Management'; 'Namami Gange'; 'Samagra Shiksha'; and 'Holistic Development of Districts'.

These webinars were attended by about 1000 officials from Ministries/Departments, State Governments and District Collectors. Given the encouraging response, it was decided to continue the initiative of organizing the National Good Governance Webinar Series in the year 2025 - 2026.

In the above backdrop, The Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) continues its commitment towards improving governance by celebrating exemplary practices adopted by districts under the Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration. In this context, the 28th National Good Governance webinar on the theme "Holistic Development of Districts" was organized on 26<sup>th</sup> June, 2025.

The webinar highlighted success stories from two districts – Kupwara, J&K and Tinsukia, Assam, which have emerged as models in implementing flagship schemes through innovative governance and convergence of efforts.

# WELCOME ADDRESS

The session was chaired by **Shri V. Srinivas, Secretary, Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG)**, who set the stage by outlining the saturation approach adopted under the Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration framework.

**Secretary, DARPG** highlighted the background of the Webinar that is organized in pursuance of the direction of Hon'ble Prime Minister in Civil Services day 2022 in which he suggested that virtual session should be conducted and the award winner should be invited to share their experiences. Holistic Development was the theme taken up at the Civil Services Day and awards were given for the performance of districts on 12 priority sector schemes. He appreciated the dedication and transformative efforts of the District Commissioners and their teams, which formed the core of the session's deliberations. He introduced the two speakers on Holistic Development of Districts: **Ms. Ayushi Sudan, IAS, District Commissioner, Kupwara** and **Shri Swapneel Paul, IAS, District Commissioner, Tinsukia**.

To contextualize the discussions, the session opened with the screening of two short films showcasing impactful implementation of government schemes in the districts of Kupwara and Tinsukia. These films featured beneficiary testimonials and highlighted how convergence and community participation had led to visible developmental outcomes in sectors such as housing, health, nutrition, water supply, renewable energy and livelihoods.

After screening of the two short films, lead speakers were invited to begin their presentations.



# SESSION – I

## BRIEF OF THE HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE OF KUPWARA DISTRICT, J&K

Kupwara, the northernmost district of Jammu & Kashmir, spans an area of approximately 2,379 sq. km (around 25.6 million sq. ft) and is surrounded by the Pir Panjal and Shams Bari ranges. The District has been honored with the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration 2024 recognizing its exceptional performance in the 'Holistic Development of Districts' Category.

Its economy is rooted in agriculture, producing 50,000 tonnes of walnuts annually (earning it the title "Walnut District") and 3 lakh tonnes of apples.

Kupwara's development has been challenged by tough terrain, harsh climate, restricted access to clean drinking water and limited market opportunities. However, despite facing challenges the district has made remarkable progress through strategic interventions. This progress is evidenced by significant increases in scheme coverages including beneficiary numbers being increased. The district had scored more than 80 marks in four schemes i.e. PM MVY, Mission Indradhanush & Saksham Aanganwadi & Poshan 2.0 respectively

The district administration has implemented a six-point strategy focusing on community participation, accountability, private sector engagement, online services, youth involvement and scheme convergence, transforming Kupwara into an emerging model of development.

The district's commitment to community participation and stakeholder engagement has been pivotal in bridging gaps between governance and citizens while fostering sustainable development across sectors.

### IMPACT OF THE INITIATIVE

- **Livelihood Generation through Local Industries:** Set up first-of-its-kind industrial units like plywood manufacturing and waste tire processing, creating 20+ direct jobs per unit and promoting local enterprise.
- **Enhancing Market Access via Digital Platforms:** Expanded digital

marketing infrastructure, boosting visibility and sales of local produce such as walnuts and apples.

- **Tourism Development in Offbeat Destinations:** Transformed Lolab Valley into a nationally recognized offbeat tourism spot (featured in Outlook Magazine), increasing tourist footfall and local income.
- **Inclusive Skilling Initiatives:** Trained 7,500+ individuals through polytechnics and launched focused vocational programs for SC/ST and PwD communities, fostering inclusive capacity building.
- **Commendable Boost in Housing:** Completed 9,618 PMAY-G houses highest in Kashmir region and delivered 1,191 PMAY-U units, ensuring dignified housing for the underserved.
- **Agro-Economic Diversification:** Established farming clusters for fish (Mawer), tomatoes (Hatchmarg), beekeeping (Gulgam), and apple/kiwi (Handwara), alongside alternative cropping and Krishi-preneurs to boost agri-entrepreneurship.
- **Strengthening Public Health Infrastructure:** Constructed Ayushman Arogya Mandir buildings and operationalized new OTs, expanding rural healthcare reach and access.
- **Empowering Women & Advancing Education For Children:** Supported 5,200 women under PMMVY with ₹3.26 crore for maternal care, while enhancing education through 300+ smart classrooms, STEM labs, and FLN programs in partnership with Pratham Foundation.
- **Widening Scheme Reach & Inclusion:** Flagship schemes saw major expansion such as Har Ghar Jal up by 46%, PMAY-G by 591%, AB-PMJAY by 70%, and Saksham Anganwadi enrollment surged 279%, benefitting over 9 lakh citizens.
- **Last-Mile Governance & Outreach:** Conducted 350+ field visits and organized 424 Viksit Bharat Yatra camps, reaching all panchayats and ensuring door-to-door awareness and service delivery.

# PROCEEDINGS

**District Commissioner, Kupwara (Jammu & Kashmir)**

Ms. Ayushi Sudan began by expressing her gratitude to the senior leadership at DARPG for the opportunity to present Kupwara District governance journey. She opened her presentation with a geographic and demographic overview of the district—located in the Northern-most district of Jammu & Kashmir, 110 KM from state capital Srinagar with an area of 2379 square kilometers and a population of approximately 8.70 lakhs. About 75% area of the district is covered by dense conifer forest, home to diverse flora and fauna rich in wildlife and scenic beauty. The district is known as Walnut District of Jammu & Kashmir which produces 50,000 tonnes of Walnut annually. The District also produces 3 lakh tonnes of apple per year as well. With the district administration initiative tourism has improved in the last couple of years.

Given the tough terrain and extreme climate conditions, Ms. Ayushi emphasized the inherent challenges, including limited job opportunities, low access to clean drinking water, limited market opportunities and low awareness of government schemes. To address these challenges, the district administration initiated 'Government at the Door Steps,' appointing Prabharis for each village, conducting public darbars, awareness camps and outreach programs to inform people about government schemes. Additionally, the district administration undertakes capacity-building programs to train administrative officers and staff, ensuring adherence to government directives to the ground.



She highlighted the low female literacy rate and the need for women-driven enterprises. To address this, the district administration has formed Self-Help Groups on a large scale over the past few years and currently over 80,000 women participate in the SHG movement.

The presentation then turned to Grievance Redressal and Robust Feedback Mechanism. She showcased that with the help of the UT government Samadhan Portal and other mechanism are created for redressal of the grievances. Feedback boxes are installed in offices across the district. Useful feedbacks are also obtained during the public darbar to make policy and strategy on grievance.

The district administration has successfully implemented various schemes, including Har Ghar Jal Yojana, PMAY-G, PMAY-U, Mission Indradhanush, ABPM-JAY, PM SVANidhi, PMMVY, KCC, Saksham Anganwadi and Poshan 2.0 and PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana, and PM Vishwakarma. These schemes are being considered for PM Awards. To monitor their performance, the district administration has established a District Task Force which reviews progress regularly. Additionally, a special performance tracker has been developed for the education and ICDS sectors with the support of the Parimal team.

In agriculture, the Kupwara administration has introduced three innovative strategies to improve the Agriculture sector: Alternative Cropping, Krishi-preneurs and Crop Diversification. These strategies are designed to work together to improve the overall productivity, sustainability, and profitability of agriculture in Kupwara.

She highlighted that one of the most significant initiatives undertaken by the Kupwara administration is the New Employment Opportunities initiative. By dovetailing existing self-employment schemes, they have successfully created over 25,000 jobs in the last two years. In order to strengthen the ITIs/Polytechnics the administration introduced Hunarmand Kupwara helping around 3000 in skill training.

She further elaborated on tourism in Kupwara district. There are certain resultants in improvement of tourism. The key initiatives undertaken for improvement of tourism in the district are: Improved security scenario, New Border Infrastructure, Registration of Homestays and Collaboration with other stakeholders. These initiatives have improved security and border

infrastructure which led to increase in tourists from 40,000 in 2020-21 to almost 4 lakh in 2024-25.

In the education sector, she highlighted that the district administration has identified 85 key performance indicators across six thematic areas to enhance planning and monitoring. This initiative has led to improved outcomes in the education sector. Additionally, the administration has leveraged technology to drive progress, establishing over 300 smart classrooms that utilize audio-visual tools to facilitate better understanding. They have established ICT labs, STEM labs, border library blocks and additional classrooms which are equipped with state of the art infrastructure. Furthermore, biometric attendance for teachers has been introduced to ensure 100 percent attendance and accountability.

The district administration in collaboration with the Pratham Foundation launched a dedicated program focused on Functional Literacy and Numeracy, through the existing resources. Additionally, bridge courses were devised for children who struggled to keep pace with their current level. Notably, these courses have yielded a 30% improvement in children's performance in Math, Hindi, and Urdu.

In the health sector, the administration has achieved significant gains including 100% ANC registration, institutional delivery and immunization, ensuring access to free healthcare under Ayushman Bharat. Building on this success, the administration is now focusing on strengthening health infrastructure. With the support of PM's Award money and with the support of the UT government they have established four government run dialysis centers across the district. New buildings have been constructed for Health and Wellness Centers (HWCs)/Ayushman Arogya Mandirs, providing quality infrastructure for healthcare staff and the public. Notably, over the past two years the administration has operationalized three new Operation Theatres (OTs) in the district using Aspirational District funds.

In her closing remarks, she acknowledged the tireless efforts of the field officers, community stakeholders, and the district administration in implementing these schemes under challenging circumstances.

# SESSION – II

## BRIEF OF THE HOLISTIC DEVELOPMENT INITIATIVE OF TINSUKIA DISTRICT, ASSAM

Tinsukia, Assam's easternmost district and economic capital spans approximately 3,790 sq. km and features a diverse terrain of fertile plains, wetlands and forested areas. The district has been honored with the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration 2024 recognizing its exceptional performance in the 'Holistic Development of Districts' Category.

Emerging as a model of holistic development in Northeast India through its impactful initiatives and exemplary governance model. Tinsukia has demonstrated remarkable progress across all aspects scoring over 80 marks in major schemes, including PM Matru Vandana Yojana, PM Svanidhi, PM Jan Aarogya Yojana and PM Awas Yojana (Urban).

The district has a significant economic upliftment for farmers and street vendors through credit schemes like KCC and PM Svanidhi and strengthened maternal health and nutrition, ensuring comprehensive care for women and children. Initiatives like the "100 Days Challenge" and mass inaugurations under "Griha Pravesh" has made rapid construction progress.

The combination of industrial significance, cultural diversity, natural resources, and effective governance initiatives positions this region as a key district in India's northeastern development landscape. The district is the first northeastern district to achieve the Legacy Waste Free status, despite having challenges like annual flood and infrastructure challenges in remote areas.

The district received accolades such as the "Assam CM Excellence Award" for Dibru Saikhowa National Park rehabilitation and the "Indian Express Excellence in Governance Award" for waste management.

### IMPACT OF THE INITIATIVE

- **Skill Development:** 8,000+ beneficiaries were trained in essential life and livelihood skills such as digital literacy, financial inclusion and basic entrepreneurship enhancing local employability.

- **Community Awareness:** 2,200+ water management specialists have been created for quality testing and monitoring practices establishing a robust community support system.
- **Governance and Outreach:** Engagement with 150 field visits by District Magistrate in 2024, promoting accountability and field level issue resolution.
- **Advancing in Gender Inclusion:** 71.53% female participation in PM Vishwakarma scheme, significantly above national average reflects strong gender inclusion in traditional trades and skills.
- **Effective health preparedness and community hygiene initiatives:** Public health interventions reduced waterborne disease cases by 54% despite facing the worst floods in 7 years.
- **Accelerated Housing Access:** Enabled property ownership for 358 landless families, with 71.8% homes completed, while registrations under PMAY surged 119.22% in rural and 48.02% in urban under the vision of secured housing for all efficiently.
- **Empowering Farmers through Financial Access:** 35,987 Kisan Credit Cards disbursing ₹396 crore facilitated agricultural resilience further expanding PM Kisan beneficiaries by 262.67%.
- **Strengthened Maternal & Child Health:** Achieved 56% reduction in maternal mortality through nutrition support under PMMVY and ensured 99% immunization coverage under Mission Indradhanush, safeguarding over 59,000 children and 58,000 pregnant women from preventable diseases.
- **Boosting Early Education & Attendance:** Upgraded 410 Anganwadis to Saksham standards, enhancing early learning and nutrition, while improving school attendance from 48% to 76% through awareness drives and support initiatives.


# PROCEEDINGS

Shri Swapneel Paul began by extending greetings to the dignitaries, participants and give thanks to Secretary, DARPG for giving opportunity to present the implementation of developmental initiative schemes in Tinsukia District, Assam.

He began the presentation with the Water Sector, highlighting significant progress of potable water in the district. The district administration has taken significant steps to ensure access to clean drinking water in rural areas. The administration has identified sources of drinking water, likely including groundwater and surface water from rivers or reservoirs. Overhead tanks are being constructed to store and distribute water to households. These tanks are crucial for maintaining a steady water supply, especially in areas with fluctuating water pressure. The goal is to provide every household with a tap water connection, ensuring access to clean drinking water.

Over the last three years, functional household tap connections have surged from 65,679 (January 2023) to 201,656 (February 2025), marking a remarkable 207.03% increase. The development of Village/City Water Action Plans for 1048 villages and 6 towns across Tinsukia district, along with the implementation of a data collection and monitoring tool based on the m-Water App, is a significant step towards ensuring sustainable water supply and management.



Significant Reduction in Waterborne Diseases in Tinsukia District – During the 2024 flood season, Tinsukia district witnessed a remarkable decline in waterborne disease incidents. Despite experiencing the worst floods in seven years, the district reported a substantial drop in waterborne disease cases, from 1,011 in 2023 to 468 in 2024. This 53.7% reduction can be attributed, in part, to a strategic shift in water purification efforts.

Tinsukia district achieved a 60% reduction in halogen tablet usage for water purification during the 2024 flood season, resulting in a significant decrease in waterborne disease cases despite severe flooding. This progress highlights the district administration's effective efforts to improve water purification, sanitation, and healthcare infrastructure, ultimately leading to better health outcomes for the community.

Tinsukia district uses a 5-star rating system to promote water efficiency in its water projects, with 57 schemes selected for upgradation and 4 already upgraded. The district administration has also implemented QR code-based information boards in all Piped Water Supply Schemes, enhancing transparency and allowing citizens to access information and submit grievances. This initiative provides details on water supply schemes, including water testing dates and daily supply amounts.

The district administration implements both PMAY (R) and PMAY (U) in Tinsukia district. In the last three years, the number of houses constructed in rural areas has increased by 119.22 percent, from 15,606 houses constructed in January 2023 to 34,213 houses in February 2025. While in the urban sector, the number of constructed houses increased by 48.02 percent in the last three years from 3492 in 2023 to 5169 in 2025. The greatest impact of constructing new houses is that 358 landless families now got their own properties through this initiative. Additionally, 71.8 percent which is about 16 thousand houses built under PMAY also got toilet, gas, electricity and water supply.

The PMAY implementation faced challenges, particularly in identifying eligible beneficiaries. To address this, the administration utilized the Awas survey mechanism, which helped ensure to identify and include as many eligible beneficiaries as possible. The Awas survey helped increase the coverage of the scheme, ensuring that those who needed it most were included.

He highlighted that since PMAY is operated in PPP mode, it was observed that a large number of beneficiaries were falling prey to fraudulent messages. Some individuals posing as masons, would approach the beneficiaries and ask for advance payments for building the house, but would then abscond with the

money without constructing the house and the number of such complaints are increasing. So, the district administration developed a list of masons for every block and Gram Panchayat of the district and shared the list specifying that these are the trained masons authorized to build houses in a particular area for the beneficiaries to subscribe to.

Since the Gram Panchayats are the nodal agency for the implementation of the PMAY rural scheme, the district administration issued a 100-day challenge where the Gram Panchayats and Wards compete among themselves to see which Ward or Gram Panchayat can complete the most number of houses within this period and the Ward or GP that wins the challenge is awarded.

Another problem is that the Gram Panchayat Coordinators barely visit the construction sites, which hampers the progress of the work. As continuous visits by the Gram Panchayat Coordinators at the grassroots level are instrumental for the timely completion of houses, the district administration started an e-Tour Diary which mandated the Gram Panchayat Coordinators to visit at least 50 under-construction houses every week. This helps in monitoring the progress of construction and governance parameters for the implementation of the scheme. As a result, a mass inauguration of new houses took place on 19.01.2025, where 889 houses were inaugurated.

Further, in his presentation, Shri Swapneel Paul, outlined a dynamic and inclusive livelihood strategy aimed at enhancing income generation and financial resilience across the district. The approach focused on empowering farmers, vendors, artisans, and informal workers through targeted schemes, improved financial access, and institutional support. Over the past two years, Tinsukia has made remarkable strides in saturating key livelihood schemes and formalizing previously unregulated sectors.

A key achievement was the issuance of 35,987 Kisan Credit Cards (KCC), including renewals, resulting in a total disbursement of ₹396 crore. This credit infusion enabled farmers to invest in quality inputs, diversify crops, and expand operations. Additionally, 811 Animal Husbandry KCCs and 174 Fishery KCCs were issued, disbursing ₹6.05 crore and ₹3.07 crore respectively—thereby supporting allied agricultural activities and promoting rural entrepreneurship.

To semi-formalize the informal workforce, the district introduced identity cards, created sectoral databases, linked individuals to banks, and organized capacity-building programs. These measures brought dignity and structure to thousands of previously unrecognized workers. Through extensive surveys,

7,185 individuals were identified under PM SVANidhi, 72,868 under PM Kisan, and 3,116 under PM Vishwakarma—ensuring accurate beneficiary mapping and inclusion in government schemes.

Innovative outreach mechanisms like “Aadhaar on Wheels” enrolled 1,274 individuals, improving access to entitlements. Vending and vocation committees were established in all villages and towns to ensure decentralized governance and support for street vendors and skilled workers. Financial literacy, insurance, and bank linkage programs reached 35,286 beneficiaries, building a foundation for long-term financial stability.

Community engagement remained central. QR codes were issued to 2,446 street vendors, enhancing digital visibility and traceability. Insurance camps for schemes such as PMJJBY, PMSBY, and APY covered 28,139 individuals, extending social security to vulnerable populations. Further, 1,219 street food vendors were trained under the Eat Right campaign and received FSSAI certification, boosting hygiene and consumer confidence.

The impact of these initiatives is reflected in the data: PM SVANidhi beneficiaries increased by 113.48%, PM Kisan by 262.67%, and 2,835 individuals have already benefitted under PM Vishwakarma since its launch in September 2023. These outcomes signify the emergence of a robust and inclusive livelihood ecosystem fostering income enhancement, dignity, and opportunity.

Shifting focus to public health, Shri Paul presented Tinsukia’s targeted, data-driven approach to improving maternal and child health outcomes. The district witnessed a significant reduction in maternal mortality, from 39 deaths in 2022–23 to 17 in 2023–24—a reduction of over 56%—despite geographical challenges and a scattered tea garden population.

Key to this success was the saturation of critical health schemes. Under Mission Indradhanush, 59,337 children and 58,066 pregnant women were vaccinated over two years, achieving 99% coverage. The Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) benefitted 21,291 women, reaching 90.5% saturation and encouraging institutional deliveries.

Ayushman Bharat PMJAY was strategically leveraged, resulting in 368 terminally ill patients—many cancer-afflicted—being referred to metro cities for advanced care. Enrollments under PMJAY surged from just 4,083 in January 2023 to 618,520 by February 2025, with 17,200 beneficiaries availing treatment, demonstrating a transformative expansion of health access.

Localized execution strategies included distributing 362 digital pressure kits to ASHA workers in tea garden areas to monitor for pre-eclampsia and anemia. SOPs were formulated for inter-block migration of pregnant women, ensuring continuity of care. The 108 ambulance network was restructured to enhance emergency response.

Innovative community engagement mechanisms supported these efforts. The “Pokhila Team” resolved 23 vaccine hesitancy cases and promoted institutional births. The "Miss Hemoglobin" musical series raised awareness on maternal health at the village level and was culturally tailored for local impact. The Pokhila model has since been adopted for statewide rollout by NHM Assam.

These initiatives collectively demonstrate Tinsukia’s holistic public health strategy—one that integrates infrastructure, frontline empowerment, and behavioral change to save lives and improve wellbeing.

In the education sector, he highlighted the district’s comprehensive efforts to address learning losses post-COVID-19. The upgradation of 410 Anganwadi Centres into “Saksham Anganwadis” with digital tools and learning materials marked a major leap in early childhood development. Operational efficiency rose significantly, with centers open at least 21 days a month increasing from 8.51% to 96.68%.

Inclusive education efforts included the issuance of 3,526 Unique Disability ID (UDID) cards, up from 1,284, enabling targeted support for children with special needs. School attendance rose from 48% to 76%, signaling strong re-engagement. The Siksha Setu App, using facial recognition, was deployed across 100% of schools to track student and teacher attendance for accountability and timely interventions.

To promote STEM education, astronomical labs were set up in every block, with a focus on Tea Garden schools. Under the AAROHAN program, 120 Class 9 toppers received mentorship, benefitting 349 students in total. A Digital Divyangjan Atlas integrated data of 7,112 individuals with LGD codes to aid policy planning.

Innovative community programs like the Mother Buddy initiative and Divyang Bandhu ensured maternal guidance and inclusion of differently-abled children. Together, these steps represent a resilient and inclusive educational framework geared toward long-term transformation.

He also presented the recognitions and accolades received by the district as a testament to its impactful governance. Tinsukia received the Assam Chief

Minister's Karmashree Award for rehabilitating 163 families from Dibru Saikhowa National Park, resolving a decades-old issue through humane, lawful, and participatory means.

Nationally, Tinsukia was honored with the Indian Express Excellence in Governance Award 2025 under the Swacchata category for disposing of 1.53 lakh metric tonnes of legacy waste, becoming the first Legacy Waste Free district in the North-East.

The Prime Minister himself mentioned Tinsukia's Hoolock Gibbon conservation initiative in his "Mann Ki Baat" address on August 25, 2024, highlighting its biodiversity preservation efforts. In healthcare, the district earned the MusQan certification for its Civil Hospital—the first in the North-East—and secured NQAS certification for 16 facilities, the highest for any district in the region.

Concluding the presentation, Shri Paul shared powerful testimonials from citizens, offering real-life stories of transformation. From Diganta Mili's village receiving flood-resilient water supply under the "No One Left Thirsty" campaign, to Purnima Gogoi Phukan's rise from a small farmer to a ₹7-lakh-a-year agri-entrepreneur, the narratives reflected ground-level impact.

The journey of Mislina, a child with congenital heart disorder who recovered through PMJAY support, and Rajani Kanta Sinha's experience of reduced electricity bills and sustainability through the Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana, underscored the human dimension of governance.

These testimonials affirmed that Tinsukia's development model is not just about data and policies—it is about dignity restored, opportunities created, and lives transformed.
