

BACKGROUND

The Hon'ble Prime Minister had mandated the Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances (DARPG) to hold virtual conferences/webinars with District Collectors and other officers. A specific theme/sector may be taken up in each month, which past award winners since the inception of the scheme under that sector are invited to present their experiences.

In his address on Civil Services Day, 2022, the Hon'ble Prime Minister suggested that training institutes should conduct virtual sessions of one to one and half hours with the award winners as the Lead Speakers, to disseminate the best practices.

Accordingly, DARPG conducts National Good Governance Webinars, one webinar a month on different themes, on the last Friday of every month, over the year 2022 - 2024, to highlight and disseminate the best practices and sharing of experiences of the award-winning institution to facilitate replication by other States/Districts.

These Webinars covered the PM award winning initiatives on the themes 'Improving Public Service Delivery'; 'Health'; 'Aspirational District Programme'; 'Public Grievance Redressal'; 'Environment', 'Public Participation (Jan Bhagidari) through Swachh Bharat Mission'; 'Innovations at District and State levels'; 'Jal/Water Management'; 'Namami Gange'; 'Samagra Shiksha'; and 'Holistic Development of Districts'.

These webinars were attended by about 1000 officials from Ministries/Departments, State Governments and District Collectors. Given the encouraging response, it was decided to continue the initiative of organizing the National Good Governance Webinar Series in the year 2025 - 2026.

In the above backdrop, The Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG) continues its commitment towards improving governance by celebrating exemplary practices adopted by districts under the Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration. In this context, the 30th National Good Governance webinar on the theme "Innovation - District" was organized on 29th August, 2025.

The webinar highlighted successful initiative from two Districts – Moradabad and Kurung Kumey, which have emerged as models in innovative governance.

WELCOME ADDRESS

The session was chaired by **Shri V. Srinivas**, Secretary, Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG). In his opening remarks, he outlined the **innovative practices in governance** adopted under the *Prime Minister's Awards for Excellence in Public Administration* framework. He emphasized that the webinar was organized in pursuance of the direction given by the Hon'ble Prime Minister during **Civil Services Day 2022**, where the Prime Minister had suggested that **virtual sessions** be held to allow award winners to share their experiences.

The Secretary noted that a significant number of awardees from various districts and states have already presented their successful initiatives through this platform. He appreciated the **dedication and transformative governance efforts** of the **districts of Moradabad and Kurung Kumey**, which were the focal points of the session.

He also introduced the **keynote speakers** for the theme "*Innovation – District*": **Shri Anuj Singh, IAS**, District Magistrate, Moradabad, Uttar Pradesh and **Ms. Vishakha Yadav**, Deputy Commissioner, Papum Pare, Arunachal Pradesh.

To set the context for the discussion, the session began with the **screening of two short films** highlighting impactful implementation of government schemes in **Moradabad and Kurung Kumey**. These films featured beneficiary testimonials and highlighted how convergence and community participation had led to visible developmental outcomes that provide valuable resources and support to people with disabilities in Moradabad district and transform the education system by integrating cutting-edge digital infrastructure in Kurung Kumey.

Following the screenings, the keynote speakers were invited to present their experiences and insights.



SESSION – I

BRIEF OF SUGAMYA PUSTAKALYA INITIATIVE, MORADABAD, UTTAR PRADESH

Sugamya Pustakalya is an inclusive physical library specially designed for differently-abled students. This initiative caters to the blind, hearing impaired, intellectually disabled and those with locomotor challenges. Tailored to address service delivery gaps in accessibility, it integrates Braille books, audiobooks, tactile maps and assistive technologies, ensuring inclusive pedagogy. With 32 specially trained educators deployed across four libraries, the initiative emphasizes personalized learning, community involvement and digital tools to enhance educational outcomes. Sugamya Pustakalaya has not only transformed access to education but also set a replicable model for inclusive infrastructure and service delivery.

KEY ASPECTS

- First-of-its-kind accessible library initiative in Moradabad district with four centers across sub-divisions i.e., Moradabad, Kanth, Bilari and Thakurdwara.
- Initiative is a part of the Accessible India Campaign (Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan).
- Infrastructure was developed using CSR, Nagar Panchayat and Zila Panchayat funds for long-term sustainability, while technical support from institutions like NIVH (National Institute for the Visually Handicapped) and NAB (National Association for the Blind) ensured the use of best practices.
- Assistive tech includes Braille books, audiobooks, tactile maps and speech synthesis tools.
- Regular community workshops, reading sessions and media outreach to raise awareness.

IMPACT OF THE INITIATIVE

- Benefited over 4,500 differently-abled students across the district.
- Improved Braille literacy and sign language skills within 3 months of implementation
- Enabled educational continuity through digital tools even during emergencies.
- Fostered a culture of accessibility and inclusion through active community engagement.
- Established a scalable, feedback-driven model with responsive service delivery mechanisms.

PROCEEDINGS

Shri Anuj Singh began by expressing his gratitude to the senior leadership at DARPG for the opportunity to present Sugamya Pustakalya as an innovative initiative aligned with Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan, aiming to bridge critical gaps in resources and support for children with disabilities in Moradabad, Uttar Pradesh. He explained that the project provides a dedicated, inclusive environment and addresses key challenges faced by such children, including insufficient specialized support, low teacher sensitivity, limited peer inclusion and low parental engagement.

He proceeded to describe the objectives of Sugamya Pustakalya, highlighting equitable opportunities, social inclusion, independence, and improved mental health and well-being for children with disabilities, pointing out that accessible libraries act as community hubs for participation in social, educational and cultural activities. Mr. Sing narrated the journey of the project, detailing that four libraries have been established in Moradabad and its subdivisions: the first opened in Moradabad on 25th September 2023, followed by Kanth in June 2024, Bilari in July 2024 and Thakurdwara in August 2024. He noted the project's recognition by the Chief Minister with a State-Level Award on International Day of Persons with Disabilities.

Moving on to the framework, he stated that a total of 32 specially trained educators are deployed across four libraries in two shifts, qualified to teach students with diverse needs, including those who are blind, hearing impaired, intellectually disabled, or in need of physical therapy. He added that technical assistance from institutions like NIVH, NIMH, and NIHH facilitated design features such as tactile maps and shelf arrangements, while books and training materials were procured as recommended by experts. Infrastructure development was achieved through CSR funds and support from local bodies.

Mr. Singh detailed the facilities provided at the centers, including Braille books, slates, large print books, Taylor frames, abacus, geometric kits, Daisy players, and sound balls for visually impaired children; speech synthesizers, training aids, speech-to-text devices, and sign language training for speech and hearing impaired children; worksheets, workbooks, picture boards, charts, and pencil grips for intellectually disabled children; as well as physiotherapy, orthosis, walkers, wheelchairs, crutches, and other aids for locomotor disabilities. He stated that regular medical camps are held to monitor child health and surgeries are arranged for correctable disabilities, with 178 operations conducted in the last two years. Moreover, he highlighted that 450 aids and devices have been provided free of cost and children receive nutritional supplements and pick-and-drop transportation services for convenience.

He shared the pedagogical approach, explaining that every student undergoes an initial assessment, based on which personalized course designs and adaptive learning plans are developed, taking into account emotional, cognitive and academic progress. Learning plans are reviewed regularly and adjusted as per the student's evolving needs, ensuring holistic growth in a supportive environment.

Mr. Singh then presented two case studies: Ms. Usha Rani, a visually impaired student who learned Braille and is currently completing her graduation, regularly coming to the center and assisting other students and Shri Yash Kumar, who lost his eyesight due to an accident and after learning Braille at the center resumed his studies at Inter College.

The outcomes of the program were summarized: 15 students can now write basic Braille, 27 can read basic Braille, and 3 can communicate in sign language; further, 250 visually impaired, 100 speech/hearing impaired, and 60 intellectually disabled students have benefitted, along with students able to use flashcards for numbers and alphabets.

He outlined the financials, stating the cost breakdown per library: Rs 8 lakh for infrastructure, Rs 4 lakh for equipment, Rs 1 lakh for staff salary, Rs 50,000 each for transportation and other expenses, totaling Rs 14 lakh per center. National implementation would require Rs 1,000 crore, representing about 7.5% of the Ministry's Rs 13,600 crore budget.

Mr. Singh concluded by presenting the way forward with expansion plans across all eight blocks in Moradabad, development of advanced transition centers for students above 15 years by Nagar Nigam Moradabad and Moradabad Development Authority and steps for state and national integration, including a proposal for one center in every block of UP and the country. He thanked everyone for their support and closed the presentation.

Introduction

Sugamya Pustakalaya is an innovative initiative aligned with the Sugamya Bharat Abhiyan. It aims to bridge critical gaps in support and resources for children with disabilities by creating a dedicated, inclusive environment. It addresses key challenges faced by children with disabilities:

- Insufficient Specialized Support: Withouly 45 educators serving 4,500 students across 1,100 schools, there is a significant shortage of dedicated support for children with disabilities.
- Low Sensitivity among Teachers: In most schools, around 2—4 children with disabilities are present, leading to a lack of specialized course design and focused attention.
- Limited Peer Inclusion: With just 2–4 children with disabilities per school, opportunities for dedicated social interaction and group support are minimal
- Low Parental Engagement: Some parents display reluctance and resentment, further hindering their children's progress.

Objectives



Equitable Opportunity: It ensures that everyone, regardless of their abilities, has the same access to information, education, and cultural resources, helping to dose the gap in opportunities between disabled and non-disabled individuals.



Social Inclusion: Libraries serve as community hubs. Accessible libraries enable disabled individuals to participate in social, educational, and cultural activities, reducing isolation and promoting inclusionin society.



Independence: Accessible libraries enable disabled individuals to engage with information and resources without relying on others, fostering a sense of independence and selfsufficiency.



Improved Mental Her and Well-being: Acces reading materials, cult

Improved Mental Health and Well-being: Access to reading materials, cultural activities, and learning opportunities in libraries can enhance the mental health and well-being of disabled individuals by reducing feelings of isolation and promoting cognitive engagement.






Regular medical camps are organized at the Centres to monitor the health improvements of the children

- For those whose disabilities can be corrected through surgery, operations are arranged through CSR/State
 funding, with 178 surgeries (Cochlear Implant, Congenital Cataract, Club foot, Cleft lip,etc.) conducted in the
 past two years
- Additionally, children in need of equipment or aids receive these free of cost through CSR/State funds, with **450** aids provided to date.
- **Nutritional supplements**—including dates, roasted channa, and milk—are supplied to meet the dietary needs of the children
- Furthermore, pick-and-drop services are available at the center to ensure convenience for all students.

In essence, the Sugamya Pustakalaya serves as a comprehensive, **one-stop solution** addressing every need of children with disabilities.








अंजनेय कुमार सिंह ने बताया कि यह मंडल के लिए दूसरी बड़ी उपलब्धि है। इससे पहले उन्होंने रामपुर में कुपोषण के खिलाफ काफी कार्य कराया था। इसी वजह से उनके कार्यकाल में रामपुर को अवॉर्ड मिला था।

Expansion in Moradabad

The project is being expanded to cover all 8 blocks of Moradabad district, and is being extended to every subdivision of the Moradabad Division



Advanced Transition Centres

Nagar Nigam Moradabad and Moradabad Development Authority are developing two advanced transition centres to support students above 15 years, equipping them with the skills and guidance needed for their future endeavors



State-Level Integration

The project has been presented to the Principal Secretary, who has appreciated the initiative and steps are being taken to integrate it into state policy, with plans to establish one centre per block across UP



National Implementation & Cost Analysis

Running one library costs approximately 14 lakhs. With 7,256 blocks across India, nationwide implementation would require roughly 1,000 crore, which constitutes about 75% of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment's 13,600 crore budget





SESSION – II

BRIEF OF PROJECT DIGIKAKSHA, KURUNG KUMEY, ARUNACHAL PRADESH

PROJECT DIGIKAKSHA is a transformative digital education initiative designed to deliver foundational literacy, numeracy and skill development to students from Pre-Primary to Senior Secondary, Self-Help Groups (SHGs), school dropouts and marginalized youth in some of the most inaccessible and underserved border regions of Arunachal Pradesh.

DIGIKAKSHA is a pioneering educational initiative implemented in remote, network- deprived Indo-China and Indo-Myanmar border areas of Arunachal Pradesh. It creates a blended learning ecosystem through customized digital infrastructure, preloaded interactive content and community-driven pedagogy, aimed at empowering tribal children, SHGs and unemployed youth.

KEY ASPECTS

- Led by local village chiefs, PRI (Panchayati Raj Institutions) members, SHGs, and youth groups, fostering a social movement.
- Training for teachers, Gaon Boras, SHGs collaboration with EduTech partners for ongoing tech support.
- Over 3000 beneficiaries including children, youth, women and dropouts; operational across Tirap and Kurung Kumey districts.
- Implemented on government land, governed by a local board, convergence with schemes like PM Swavlamban Yojana and ASRLM (Assam State Rural Livelihoods Mission).

IMPACT OF THE INITIATIVE

- Enhanced school and teacher attendance, improved CBSE pass rates and record-breaking selections in APSC (Assam Public Service Commission) exams.
- Operational within 50 km from Indo-China border and replicated in Indo-Myanmar border regions, the initiative significantly enhanced community engagement in the learning process.
- Disaster-resilient infrastructure evaluated for sustainability and adopted in multiple districts.

PROCEEDINGS

Following the presentation of Shri Anuj Singh, DM, Moradabad, the session was handed over to Ms. Vishakha Yadav, Deputy Commissioner, Papum Pare. She was introduced by Shri V. Srinivas, Secretary, DARPG.

Ms. Vishakha Yadav began by expressing her gratitude to the senior leadership at DARPG for the opportunity to present DIGI-KAKSHA Project, the initiative of the Kurung Kumey district, Arunachal Pradesh which represents the integrated approach toward igniting foundational growth and building a vibrant village ecosystem in Koloriang, a district on the Indo-China border in Arunachal Pradesh. DIGI-KAKSHA was conceptualized to address the stark developmental realities faced by our people, including 84 underdeveloped tribal villages and a population of 45,000 all striving for mainstream national integration but challenged by recurring natural disasters, particularly landslides and heavy rainfall that peaks at 1100mm, as evidenced by the major disaster of June 2024.

She highlighted how the district confronts poor connectivity with a road density of just 2.5% and over 55% of the region in a network shadow zone lacking WiFi access. They are also burdened with low human development indicators: the literacy rate stands at only 49%, Foundational Literacy and Numeracy at 9% and the CBSE pass rate in 2024 was a mere 29%. Out-migration is high at 32 per thousand according to the 2011 Census and the region suffers from rising drug use and unemployment among children and youth compounded by a lack of motivation and exposure, frequent electoral violence and limited livelihood options mainly restricted to subsistence farming.

Recognizing these challenges, DIGI-KAKSHA targets a wide array of beneficiaries: tribal children, youth, Anganwadi workers, community volunteers and Self-Help Groups (SHGs). The strategy starts with the creation of multi-state-of-the-art Building as Learning Aid (BALA) infrastructure that utilizes environment-friendly local materials and provides individual learning pods with acoustic noise cancellation. This infrastructure supports the motto "LEARN" and houses 10,000 donated books, offering multi-purpose spaces for any social activity through thoughtfully designed theme-based corners.

The district administration then introduced a comprehensive, all-inclusive customized interactive Android learning system, featuring 80-inch 4K screens for immersive bilingual learning that covers the CBSE curriculum from pre-primary to class 12. The system includes simplified audio-video content, MCQs, interactive tools, activity-based teacher guides and advanced educational resources such as STEM tools, 3D animations and simulations. Special provisions are made for children with special needs, integrating phonetics software and voice-recording features to help develop verbal communication skills.

To bridge the digital divide and boost livelihoods, for the first time, Anganwadi workers have accessed remote digital literacy and training on critical applications like the Facial Recognition System, allowing them to disseminate government schemes efficiently even in the remotest circles of the district. The administration formed 85 SHGs under the Arunachal State Rural Livelihoods Mission, giving hands-on tech training and supporting local entrepreneurship in bamboo basketry, kiwi farming and other areas.

DIGI-KAKSHA has evolved into a social movement around education. Administrative officers and department heads contribute weekly to improve CBSE results. Volunteer-led evening "Pathshaala" sessions guide youth, drop-outs and drug addicts, while Saturday "Bagless Activity Days" take children beyond academics for holistic growth. They are reintegrating children affected by drugs and poverty by mobilizing local leadership, notably the Gaon Buras, backed by substantial community labor and financial contributions.

In preserving local culture, the administration established a traditional corner with more than 150 books in the Nyishi and other tribal languages, encouraging early learning of tribal alphabets and rituals, story narration by elders, live artifact displays and regular cultural events like "Cultural Wednesdays".

The project focuses heavily on livelihood generation, establishing 85 SHGs, introducing technological training and promoting products like ginger jam and king chili pickle. Awareness sessions and rehabilitation classes on drugs are run by Police and ICDS, while adult and digital literacy sessions are conducted for Gaon Boras. They also ensure saturation and convergence of all flagship government schemes for beneficiaries in remote border circles, covering programs like PM-JAY, immunization, Vishwakarma and Swavlamban.

Ms. Vishakha Yadav shared the key achievements such as: student attendance and learning outcomes improved from 43.5% to 52%; CBSE Class-X pre-board pass rates rose from 29% to 56.5%; 85 new SHGs were created and trained, now with 438 active members, compared to previously defunct groups; flagship scheme saturation for PM-JAY increased from 7% to 74% and immunization coverage from 90% to 95%. The number of APSC prelims qualifiers grew from 26 to 61; 285 Anganwadi workers are now trained in the Facial Recognition System and Poshan Tracker; 85 drug awareness sessions were held and the administration successfully ran community campaigns like the Airgun Surrender Abhiyaan and wildlife hunting bans, training 100 disaster volunteers. Critically, intensive election training and exposure visits for officers reduced electoral violence: from 19 repolls and four deaths in 2019, they saw only one repoll and no violence or FIRs in 2024.

Finally, Ms. Yadav highlighted their plan for sustainability, using local resources and fostering continuous community involvement. DIGI-KAKSHA's model is being replicated in Tirap district along the Indo-Myanmar border and expanded to other regions, demonstrating its potential for broader application. She thank all community stakeholders, volunteers and administrators who have ensured the success and continued progress of the DIGI-KAKSHA initiative.

In her closing remarks, she acknowledged that DIGI-KAKSHA project has been nationally recognized receiving the Prime Minister's Award for Excellence in Public Administration in the category of "Innovation – District" in 2024.
