1. Background

The Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances institutionalised National e-Governance Webinar Series to showcase the award-winning initiatives that have received the prestigious National Award for Excellence in e-Governance, with the objective of greater learning, dissemination and replication.

These initiatives have leveraged technology to improve governance with a potential to enhance efficiency, transparency and inclusivity of government operations. By harnessing the power of digital tools and data analytics, governments can streamline administrative processes, expedite service delivery, and make informed policy decisions.

The National e-Governance Webinar Series focuses on the following themes:

- Government Process Re-engineering by use of technology for Digital Transformation
- Innovation by Use of AI and other new age technologies for Citizen- Centric Services
- Best e-Governance Practices/Innovation in Cyber Security
- Grassroots Level Initiatives for Deepening / Widening of Service Delivery
- Replication And Scaling Up of Successful National Awarded Projects like NAeG, Prime Minister Awards in Excellence, Awards conferred by other Central Ministries by State/UT/District
- Digital transformation by use of data analytics in digital platforms by Central Ministries / States/UTs

NeGW seeks to foster a culture of continuous learning, skill development, and knowledge exchange. Each webinar emphasises on a unique e-governance theme, featuring award-winning initiatives that have demonstrated outstanding contributions to their respective domains. NeGW aims to inspire and instill a new spirit of enthusiasm among administrators and stakeholders involved in government programs' implementation.

- The third webinar of the NeGW Series 2025-26 was convened on 'Innovation by Use of AI & Other New Age Technologies for Providing Citizen Centric Services (Central Level)' on October 17th, **2025**. The webinar highlighted innovative projects at the level of Central Government that leverage AI and other new age technologies to enhance the delivery of citizen-centric services. The focus is on the creative application of AI and other new age technologies to streamline processes, improve user experience, and provide more efficient, personalized, and accessible public services. The

solution should lead to tangible improvements in service delivery, accessibility, responsiveness, or transparency, contributing to a more inclusive and digitally empowered society.

2. Theme

The theme of the third session of NeGW 2025-26 held on **October 17th, 2025** was **Innovation by Use of AI & Other New Age Technologies for Providing Citizen Centric Services (Central Level)**.

The award-winning initiatives under this theme highlight the transformative potential of digital innovation in deepening citizen inclusion and efficiency as Digital India Bhashini bridges linguistic divides through AI-powered translation, voice recognition, and multilingual access across 36+ Indian languages, empowering millions to seamlessly access governance, healthcare, and financial services in their native tongues. Meanwhile, Digi Yatra revolutionizes air travel through secure facial recognition and decentralized digital identity, offering passengers a paperless, contactless, and seamless airport experience that embodies the vision of privacy, efficiency, and citizen-centric service delivery in the digital era.

3. Proceedings

3.1. Welcome Address

Smt. Sarita Chauhan, Joint Secretary, DARPG, welcomed all the participants to the third session of the National e-Governance Webinar Series 2025-26, focusing on the theme ‘Innovation by Use of AI & Other New Age Technologies for Providing Citizen Centric Services (Central Level)’. She extended a warm welcome to all attendees and highlighted that the National Awards for e-Governance, instituted in 2003, stand as one of the flagship initiatives of the Government of India to recognize excellence in digital governance. Over the years, nearly 300 initiatives have been awarded for their exemplary contributions towards digitization, transparency, accountability, and inclusiveness: key enablers in driving India’s progress towards Viksit Bharat.

She emphasized that the category ‘Innovation by Use of AI and Other New Age Technologies for Providing Citizen-Centric Services’ was introduced recently to acknowledge the transformative role of emerging technologies in governance. The response from both large and small institutions has been encouraging, showcasing innovative solutions designed to enhance service delivery, reduce costs, and improve ease of living for citizens.

Smt. Chauhan further noted that each award-winning initiative reflects a unique approach to solving governance challenges, promoting learning, knowledge sharing, and replication of best practices across the country. She welcomed the two presenters of the day, representatives of the award-winning initiatives Digital India BHASHINI from the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, and Digi Yatra from the Ministry of Civil Aviation, whose pioneering efforts exemplify the spirit of innovation in citizen-centric digital transformation.

3.2. Shri Amitabh Nag, CEO, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology

Following the Joint Secretary's opening remarks, Shri Amitabh Nag, CEO, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, delivered a comprehensive presentation on the Digital India BHASHINI initiative, implemented by the Digital India Corporation under the National Language Translation Mission (NLTM). He explained that BHASHINI is a flagship initiative of the Government of India that seeks to transcend India's linguistic diversity and make digital governance accessible to all citizens, irrespective of language or literacy barriers. By harnessing the power of Artificial Intelligence (AI), Machine Learning (ML), and Natural Language Processing (NLP), BHASHINI is enabling the creation of a digitally inclusive society where language ceases to be a barrier in communication, collaboration, or access to public services.

Elaborating on the technological architecture of the platform, Shri Nag stated that BHASHINI provides five core AI-driven services: Automatic Speech Recognition, Text-to-Text Translation, Text-to-Speech Conversion, Optical Character Recognition (OCR), and Named Entity Recognition. These services collectively enable digital systems to understand, translate, and respond to users in their native languages. He mentioned that AI models have been developed for 22 Indian languages for voice, 36 for text translation, and 18 for OCR, laying the foundation for a multilingual digital ecosystem. By integrating these technologies into government and citizen-facing platforms, BHASHINI is bridging linguistic divides and fostering inclusivity across sectors.

He described BHASHINI as a Digital Public Infrastructure (DPI) that combines AI models and data layers within an open, interoperable framework. This allows the continuous onboarding of new languages, datasets, and domain-specific models, making it a living, evolving platform that grows with citizen participation. Beyond technology, the mission also contributes to language preservation and cultural continuity by digitizing underrepresented regional languages and dialects. To address the challenge of limited linguistic data, over 300 contributors have been engaged in field data collection and validation across states, creating a vast repository of voice and text datasets that strengthen the accuracy and adaptability of AI models.

In his presentation, Shri Nag demonstrated how BHASHINI's applications are transforming service delivery across multiple domains of governance. In policing and internal security, it supports multilingual translation of Zero FIRs and case diaries in collaboration with the National Crime Records Bureau and State Police Departments. In agriculture, it enables farmers to interact with advisory systems through voice-based interfaces in their local languages, allowing them to seek and receive guidance in Marathi, Odiya, and other regional languages. In the education sector, it is being integrated with the DIKSHA platform to provide multilingual educational content and develop audio books for enhanced accessibility. In banking and financial services, BHASHINI enables voice-based payment journeys where users can perform secure financial transactions through voice commands with authentication. It has also been integrated with the e-Office system, allowing government officials to dictate notes and documents through speech recognition, improving productivity and reducing manual effort.

In the healthcare sector, BHASHINI is working with the e-Hospital platform to facilitate doctor-patient communication and automatic transcription of prescriptions, while in rural governance, it is being used through the SABHASAR application of the Ministry of Panchayati Raj to transcribe audio minutes of panchayat meetings into machine-readable text. The initiative has also supported multilingual communication during large-scale events such as the Maha Kumbh through chatbots capable of real-time translation, which handled over three lakh user sessions. Shri Nag further elaborated on innovations such as the BHASHINI Shuttle, which enables real-time speech-to-text and text-to-text translation in multiple languages, and the BHASHINI mobile application that allows two individuals to converse in different languages through its Canvas feature, an innovation that brings citizens closer to a 'Voice-First' digital India.

He highlighted that BHASHINI's technology is already embedded in national systems, with every Aadhaar card issued in the country carrying its transliteration and translation imprint. The platform is also contributing to frictionless credit for farmers, automated CV creation for blue-collar workers, and voice-based grievance redressal systems in social welfare departments. He mentioned ongoing collaborations with States such as Maharashtra, where 10,000 students are validating agriculture-specific data to improve domain-level model training and enhance accuracy in regional terminology. These partnerships, he noted, are vital for ensuring that local languages are represented in India's digital ecosystem and that every citizen, regardless of linguistic background, can interact confidently with technology.

In conclusion, Shri Nag emphasized that BHASHINI represents a national movement toward linguistic democratisation and empowerment. He called upon all States, ministries, and institutions to collaborate

in expanding the platform's reach, contribute data to strengthen regional models, and integrate BHASHINI into their service delivery frameworks. The objective, he underlined, is not to replace English or any other language, but to ensure that language ceases to be a limitation in digital participation. His presentation underscored how BHASHINI stands as a pioneering example of how emerging technologies such as AI and NLP can be leveraged to make governance inclusive, accessible, and truly citizen-centric, contributing to the vision of Viksit Bharat @2047.

3.3. Shri Suresh Khadakbhavi, CEO, Digi Yatra Foundation

Following the presentation on BHASHINI, Shri Suresh Khadakbhavi, Chief Executive Officer, Digi Yatra Foundation, delivered an insightful presentation on the project 'Digi Yatra'. He began by expressing gratitude to the Ministry of Civil Aviation for its constant support and guidance in realizing the vision of creating a seamless, secure, and paperless air travel experience in India. He highlighted that Digi Yatra was conceptualized with a passenger-first philosophy, grounded in human-centered design and built on a decentralized, privacy-preserving technology model. The initiative leverages facial biometric verification to use a passenger's face as a single secure token for all checkpoints at the airport, thereby eliminating the need for physical identity proofs or boarding passes. This innovation, he emphasised, has redefined convenience, safety, and efficiency in air travel, positioning India as a global leader in digital aviation infrastructure.

Shri Khadakbhavi traced the evolution of Digi Yatra from its initial vision stage to its large-scale national implementation. The idea, he explained, was born out of the need to address the numerous pain points faced by air travellers, from long queues and multiple document checks to repetitive manual verifications. Digi Yatra's design process placed the passenger at the core, ensuring that every feature was guided by the principle of 'customer first and always'. Developed through a collaborative and iterative approach, the initiative involved extensive consultations with regulatory authorities, industry stakeholders, airlines, and airport operators to ensure both technical robustness and operational feasibility.

He shared that the journey of Digi Yatra began with policy formulation in 2018, but its real momentum came during and after the pandemic, when the need for contactless travel became paramount. The Digi Yatra Foundation, a not-for-profit company, was established to lead the program's implementation with transparency and public trust as its cornerstones. Shri Khadakbhavi recalled that during the pandemic, the team used the period to re-engineer the platform architecture from a centralized model to a decentralized, privacy-by-design system. This shift was made possible through a national startup challenge supported by NITI Aayog's Atal Innovation Mission, leading to partnerships with innovative

Indian startups that helped build the ecosystem. The project was formally launched on 1st December 2022 at Delhi, Bengaluru, and Varanasi airports, and since then has expanded to 24 airports across the country, covering nearly 84% of total domestic air traffic.

He noted that Digi Yatra has already been downloaded by over 20 million passengers, with the app being used over 70 million times for seamless check-ins and travel. Adoption rates have been rising steadily, with several terminals recording more than 60% passenger usage, reflecting growing trust and satisfaction among travellers. The rollout, he said, will soon cover an additional 17 airports, making it available at almost all major domestic airports in India.

Explaining the technology, Shri Khadakbhavi described how the Digi Yatra app allows passengers to register using a government-issued ID (Aadhar or Driving License) to create a unique verifiable credential stored securely in their smartphone's digital wallet. The enrolment process includes OTP verification and a facial match to ensure authenticity. Once the passenger uploads the boarding pass, the app matches it with the stored identity data and shares the credential with the departure airport. On the day of travel, the passenger simply walks up to the Digi Yatra gate, where the system validates their face and boarding details in real time, granting seamless access through the airport entry, security check, and boarding gates, all without manual intervention or physical document exchange.

He emphasised that Digi Yatra's privacy-first architecture sets it apart from other digital identity systems. Built on W3C standards for Self-Sovereign Identity (SSI), it ensures that all personally identifiable information is stored locally on the user's phone, not in any central repository. The system uses verifiable credentials and decentralised identifiers (DIDs) to create secure communication between three key entities: the issuer (Digi Yatra Foundation), the holder (the passenger), and the verifier (the airport or airline). Every credential carries a unique hash value and digital signature to ensure tamper-proof verification. Once the travel journey is completed, the data is automatically purged from the system, ensuring that no residual personal information is retained anywhere. Shri Khadakbhavi proudly shared that despite having over 17 million users and more than 71 million travel instances, Digi Yatra does not store or know the personal identities of any user, demonstrating the system's unparalleled commitment to privacy and security.

He further explained how Digi Yatra has significantly improved airport efficiency and passenger convenience. Manual identity checks that earlier took up to 20 seconds are now completed within 5 seconds, thereby increasing throughput without the need for additional infrastructure. This optimization contributes to sustainability by allowing airports to handle higher passenger volumes without physical

expansion, reducing both costs and environmental impact. The contactless model also ensures a health-risk-free travel environment, an attribute that gained immense importance during the pandemic.

Looking ahead, Shri Khadakbhavi outlined Digi Yatra's vision of expanding to international travel through e-passport based enrollment. The proposed system would allow passengers to share their credentials with both the departure and destination airports, facilitating automated border control and frictionless immigration. Discussions are underway with international organizations such as IATA and ICAO to align Digi Yatra with global standards for digital travel credentials, paving the way for India's leadership in cross-border digital mobility.

He also shared new features introduced based on user feedback, such as the guardianship feature that enables parents to enroll dependent children for family travel, and the option to use Driving License-based credentials as an alternative to Aadhaar. The Digi Yatra Foundation, he added, is also developing a sandbox environment to open up the ecosystem for innovators and startups to build allied use cases — ranging from digital education credentials to visa processing, on the same verifiable credential framework. This, he noted, could one day evolve into a national digital identity layer for travel and allied services, forming part of India's broader digital public infrastructure.

Concluding his presentation, Shri Khadakbhavi reflected that Digi Yatra exemplifies India's ability to combine cutting-edge technology with citizen-centric design to create large-scale public digital platforms. Built on principles of decentralization, transparency, and data empowerment, it is not just transforming the way Indians travel but also redefining digital identity management globally. He reiterated the Foundation's commitment to continuously evolve the system, ensure privacy by design, and expand Digi Yatra's reach so that every passenger can enjoy a seamless, paperless, and stress-free air travel experience, truly realizing the vision of 'Your Face is Your Boarding Pass'.

3.4. Vote of Thanks

Shri Suvasish Das, Director, DARPG, delivered the Vote of Thanks for the session. He expressed his heartfelt gratitude to all participants for their active engagement in the third session of the National e-Governance Webinar Series 2025-26. He conveyed special thanks to Shri V. Srinivas, Secretary, DARPG, for his continued leadership and guidance in conceptualizing the National e-Governance Webinar Series, and to Smt. Sarita Chauhan, Joint Secretary (e-Governance), DARPG, for leading and chairing the session.

He extended sincere appreciation to the distinguished speakers, Shri Amitabh Nag, CEO, Digital India BHASHINI and Director, Digital India Corporation, and Shri Suresh Khadakbhavi, Chief Executive Officer, Digi Yatra Foundation, for their insightful presentations and for broadening the participants' understanding of how Artificial Intelligence and emerging technologies are transforming citizen-centric governance in India.

Shri Das also acknowledged the participation of Administrative Reforms and IT Secretaries, senior officers, and representatives from various Ministries, Departments, and State Governments, appreciating their presence and continued engagement. He emphasized that such active involvement reflects a shared national commitment to advancing digital transformation and leveraging technology for citizen empowerment.

In conclusion, he thanked all attendees for their valuable time and contributions and expressed hope for their continued participation in the forthcoming sessions of the National e-Governance Webinar Series 2025-26.
