 - It is suggested if possible that the session on gender issues be taken up by male participants/ chair otherwise again it ends up being a session on only women's issues and may not receive the kind of attention that it demands.
 - ♣ Inter-service interactivity brings de-frying among participants, breaks myths and facilitates learning.
 - Theme like "participatory scientific watershed management" may not be part of this training/workshop.
 - We were informed that this is third workshop of Inter services officers. It will be useful if the fact and finding/ outcome of past workshops are made available to others at least to present participants.
 - Feedback forms about the resource persons/ speakers should be given immediately after the session. Providing feedback form at the end of the workshop may not be that helpful as the participants does not remember the quality of the speaker who had spoken on the initial days
 - Residential accommodation is excellent. However if possible Wi-Fi facility may be provided.
 - ♣ Group activity should be given more emphasis.
 - → The course duration should be increased to 2 weeks with one week of trekking expedition.
 - A session on "meditation" could be introduced in the course.

 - The result and feedback of the course should be sent to all services heads and especially to DoPT.
